Every year, the Illinois General Assembly grants each legislator the opportunity of awarding scholarships to deserving students in their respective districts.

I am fortunate to have a scholarship committee comprised of business professionals and educators who select the winners. The committee receives the applications with all identifying information obscured to insure confidentiality. This also guarantees that the process is blind, making it impartial and unbiased. Once the committee has made their selection I have the pleasant task of awarding eight worthy constituents a one-year scholarship for full tuition at any of our state universities.

Criteria vary from legislator to legislator. Our scholarship committee uses the following criteria to determine winners:

Financial (25%): Available resources, siblings in college, dependents in family, etc.

Academic (25%): GPA, test scores, class rank, etc.

Extra Curricular (20%): Athletics, clubs, employment

Application (20%): Quality of responses

Community Involvement (10%): Volunteer, civic activities

All selections for the General Assembly Scholarship awarded by State Representative Joe Dunn are made by the Scholarship Committee.

- 1. I am happy to offer this scholarship to residents of the 96<sup>th</sup> Representative District. Please call my office if you are unsure of the district in which reside or you may access the state website at <a href="http://www.ilga.gov">http://www.ilga.gov</a> and click on **Legislator Lookup.**
- 2. You must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). A copy of this form is available in the guidance office of your high school. It is suggested that you file as soon as possible. Attach a **copy** of the original form to your application.
- 3. Incoming college freshmen; submit high school transcripts. If you have attended less than one year of college; submit college **and** high school transcripts. All others submit college transcripts only. Note: Only **official** transcripts will be accepted.
- 4. Be sure all 4 pages of the application are securely attached together.
- 5. Application packets must be **complete** and postmarked by April 12, 2005. <u>Late or</u> incomplete applications will not be considered. No exceptions.
- 6. Do not submit copies of awards, certificates, letters of recommendation, or pictures.
- 7. This scholarship covers **full tuition** at Illinois state supported institutions -- University of Illinois (Urbana, Chicago, & Springfield), Illinois State University, Northern Illinois University, Southern Illinois University, Western Illinois University, Eastern Illinois University, Governor's State University, Chicago State University, and Northeastern Illinois University.
